EYFS	Recepti on	Our children begin their artistic journey by exploring the different mediums in art such as paints and crayons. They will explore the design techniques of colour, colour mixing and line in their work such as creating spirals and curves. They will be introduced to a range of artists such as Kandinsky and Degas throughout the year. Children will also begin to think about the mediums that they are using by creating sculptures using dough and clay. All of these are complemented by activities that develop the children's fine motor skills such as cutting paper, drawing and modelling using dough.
